"Am I Allowed To or Not? The Involuntary Comedy That Is the Sexual Criminal Law"

Dear reader, who believes it is important that certain kinds of sexuality be punished, would probably not accept some of the consequences of applicable criminal laws -- consequences which, were they not so tragic for those effected, might actually be funny:

1. **12-year-old Axel and 13-year-old Horst** discover that they like each other a lot, including physically. They learn about sexuality -- a learning process that, in contrast to school lessons, occurs quite willingly and at their own initiative (if an adult were to offer them this, or provide the opportunity for them to obtain it, he would be subject to prosecution under § 180 Par. 1!). The legislator is blissfully unaware that his strident -- and undoubtedly sensible -- demand for an age limit of 14 has no effect whatsoever on the activities of these two boys.

One year later: **Axel is 13; Horst is 14**. Nothing has changed. Now, however, with the help of his minions in the justice system, the legislator does have an impact: Horst has reached the age where he is subject to punishment, and may now have to defend himself against a "Sexual Abuse of Children" (§ 176) charge.

Despite Axel's and Horst's best efforts to attempt to understand the legislator's abstruse opinions, they can't. They feel -- very much in line with the position society assigns children -- that they are too powerless to risk open conflict. Therefore, they are careful to conceal the sex they have been having -- these positive life experiences -- and thereby evade the justice system.

Another year later: **Axel is 14; Horst is 15**. Everything is fine so far. They probably have another three years now before any problems might arise. Their love is not under threat from the state. By this time, it is quite clear to them that they are gay. Although their sexual behavior is really not accepted, they believe they no longer have anything to worry about.

But in the course of time, as **Horst turns 18 (Axel is now 17)**, he takes another look at the penal code, and sees that they must keep their private lives from the clutches of the justice system for another year yet; under § 175, their kind of sexual pleasure is subject to a prison sentence of up to five years (for Horst).

The two of them have made it through unscathed, and now (Horst is 19; Axel is 18), the two are probably free to enjoy their sex lives without having to worry about interference from the justice system.

Axel and Horst have now loved one another for six years, including physically. The relationship has certainly changed; they knew very little about such things when they freely entered into the relationship; it has been a huge learning process, in which joy, lust, and satisfaction have always remained at the center, but which -- in legal terms -- consisted of frequently repeated "sexual acts," some criminal, some not; overall, in the "Horst Case" described above, a jurist would distinguish five chronological periods in which the same (sexual) acts involving the same person (Axel) would alternate between legal and illegal.

2. But there is one more "little detail": At the "Axel 13/ Horst 14" stage, they meet the handsome 18-year-old Achim, who has quite a bit of sexual anxiety; in contrast to Axel and Horst, he has resisted his homosexuality; but they gradually help him to get over that: Horst is the first one to succeed in "seducing" Achim, which later becomes an endless source of amusement for the three of them.

After our little lesson in the sexual criminal law, the attentive reader of this "case" will have certainly already realized that: Horst is simultaneously "perpetrator" and "victim": "perpetrator" according to § 176 with regard to Axel, and "victim" according to § 175 with regard to Achim, despite the fact that Horst actually "seduced" the older Achim, and the fact that it was the "victim" Horst who "performed intercourse-like acts" on the "perpetrator" Achim; thus (to prevent any misunderstanding), the "victim" penetrated the "perpetrator."

3. Another (though certainly not the final) effect of the sexual criminal law: 13-year-old Michel and 14-year-old Marion are in love. Both of them are fairly mature; they believe that the joy of sex consists in loving someone completely, and that although this is rare for young people, their love is also physical. Legally, the "case" is clear: Marion "committed sexual acts against a person under fourteen years old (a child)" and "took advantage of the child" (§ 176 Par. 1), which could cost him up to ten years in jail!

Now, both of their birthdays fall on the same day; furthermore, Marion's parents die, and she is appointed a guardian who has been wanting for a long time to put bad Michel behind bars for "ruining" "his" Marion. But it's not so simple: But when their common birthday arrives (**Michel is now 14, and Marion is 15**), their "perpetrator" and "victim" roles are reversed: The guardian is now finally able to file a report against Michel for the "Seduction" (§ 182) of Marion. Perversely, the only chance Michel has of escaping punishment is to marry her, a backdoor the legislator had graciously provided in Par. 2!

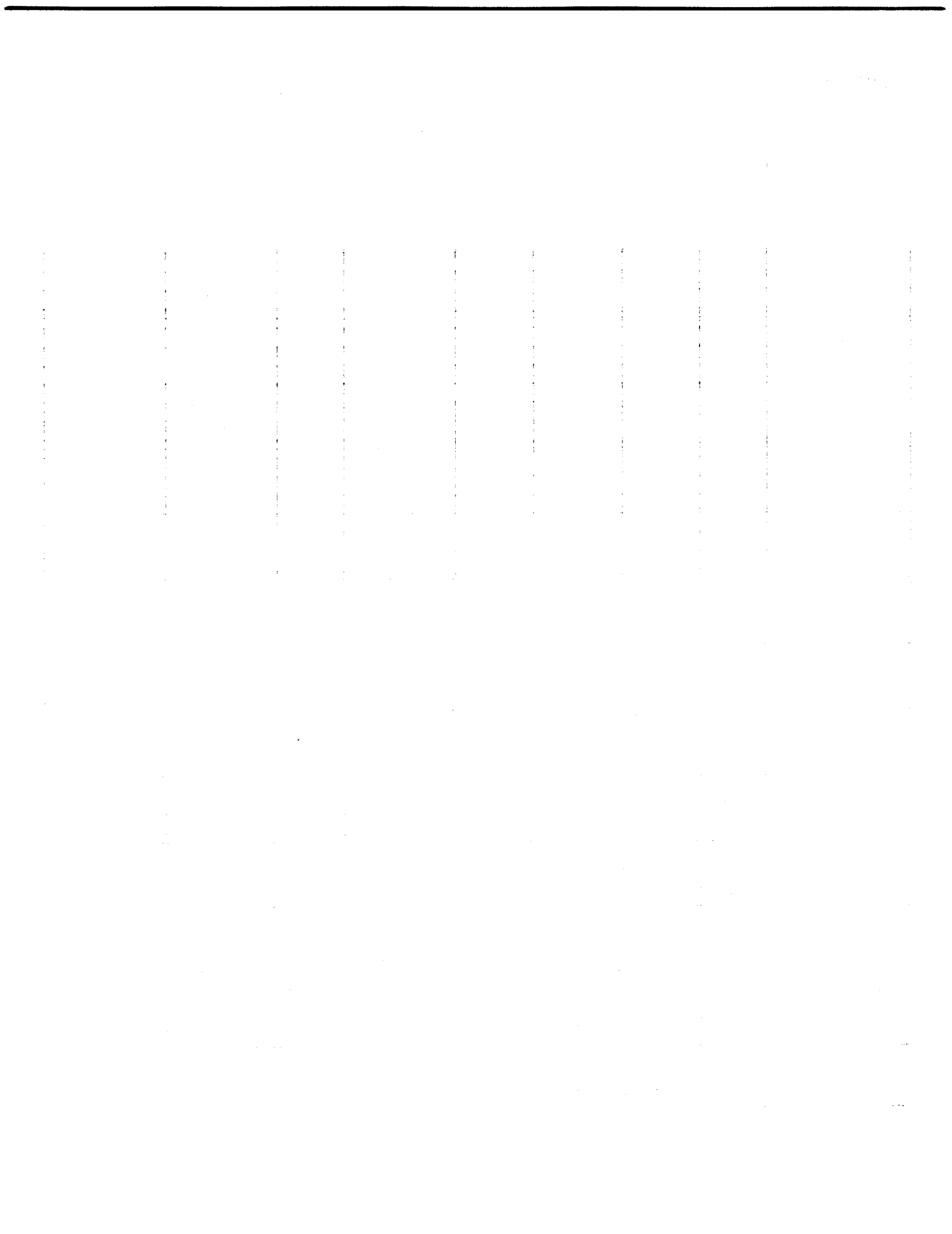
